

## National Non-Fiction November Competition 2019

Here are the terms and conditions which will apply to your entry. Please read them carefully as they contain important information.

The Federation of Children's Book Groups ("FCBG") of 1 Oakwell Close, Bragbury End, Stevenage, Hertfordshire, SG28UG, registered charity 268269 is the organiser of this competition and Lonely Planet Publications Inc of 240 Blackfriars Road, London, SE1 8NW, United Kingdom ("Lonely Planet") is the sponsor of the competition.

You can enter between 26 August 2019 at 00:01 GMT, ("Opening Date") and 6 December 2019 at 00:01 GMT ("Closing Date").

This competition is open to all eligible UK residents, including children's book groups, schools and libraries. Employees of Lonely Planet and their relatives, and members of the FCBG National Executive Committee and their relatives are not eligible to enter.

### How to enter and prize details

The competition is open to all eligible UK residents (see below for age group categories) including children's book groups, schools, and libraries in the UK.

To enter, draw your idea of a vehicle of the future and send you entry to Marc Thomas NNFN, 16 Lottage Road, Aldbourne, Wiltshire, SN8 2ED.

You don't have to buy anything to enter. By entering, you agree that all of your entry is your own work.

We will accept only one entry per child, and each individual entry must be the work of only one child. For the purpose of awarding prizes we cannot accept joint entries.

Entries should be on A4 or A3 paper, and can be of any media that suits, e.g. pens, pencils, pastels, crayons, paints, collage etc.

On the back of each entry you must write: the name and age of the child entering, plus the name of the organising book group, school or library.

All collections of entries must be accompanied by a contact name and email address of the book group, school, or library submitting them.

All independent entries must be accompanied by a contact name and email address of the parent/guardian submitting them.

Entries received after the closing date (6th December 2019) will not be eligible. If your entry is lost in the post or doesn't arrive for any other reason, that is not the fault of the competition organiser. Incomplete and invalid entries will not be accepted.

The entries will be judged in three age categories: KS1 (approx ages 5–7), KS2 (approx ages 8–11), and KS3 (approx ages 12–17)

One first prize winner and three runner-up winners will be chosen. The prizes will be as follows:

i. For the organising group/school/library of the overall winning entry:

a. 1 x Lonely Planet Kids book contributor visit (“Event”) by James Gulliver

Hancock, subject to availability. The Event must take place in 2020 and in the UK, with the Event details to be mutually agreed between Lonely Planet and the winning organising group/school/library by email (including the date, duration, location and promotion of the Event). If for any reason James Gulliver Hancock is delayed or can no longer participate, Lonely Planet will notify the winning organising group/school/library within a reasonable time to arrange a mutually agreeable alternative date and/or a suitable replacement visitor as chosen by Lonely Planet.

b. 1 x copy of each of the following Lonely Planet kids books, illustrated by

James Gulliver Hancock:

1. ‘How Cities Work’, 1st edition, Lonely Planet, 2016
2. ‘How Airports Work’, 1st edition, Lonely Planet, 2018
3. ‘How Trains Work’, 1st edition, Lonely Planet, 2019

ii. For the winning entrant:

1 x family day ticket to one of the Heritage Railway Association UK railways. The family day ticket has an approximate RRP of £60.00. There is no cash alternative. A map showing all the qualifying railways, their locations, and links to more information about them, can be found at [www.hra.uk.com](http://www.hra.uk.com). Travel to/from the heritage railway and any other expenses, fees and costs are not included in the prize.

iii. For the 3 runner-up organising groups/schools/libraries:

1 x book bundle of approximately 5 x Lonely Planet selected kids books (approximate RRP £40.00). These prize values are accurate at the start of the competition.

How is the winner chosen?

The winner will be selected by a panel of FCBG members.

The judges decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

The winner and runners-up will be contacted via their organising group/school/library (or directly by FCBG if an independent entry) and published on the FCBG website within 7 days of judging.

FCBG will do its best to contact the winners, but if they can’t, or if a winner hasn’t accepted the prize by 29th February 2019, the next best entry will be declared winner. Where there is a compelling technical or administrative reason out of FCBG’s control, the winners will be selected from all eligible entries received at that time.

If you do win

We may ask you to provide proof of identity, and age, so that we are sure you are who you say you are, and are eligible to receive the prize.

You can't exchange the prize for cash, or ask us to give it to someone else. We will use reasonable efforts to award the prize as described but if due to unforeseen circumstances we are unable to do that, we'll substitute it for another prize of comparable value.

You'll be responsible for all taxes, insurance, and any other expenses, fees and costs connected with that prize that are not included in the prize description, including travel costs.

You are responsible for your use of the prize, including complying with any applicable terms and conditions of use including those set out by [www.hra.uk.com](http://www.hra.uk.com) and its members. FCBG reserves the right to disqualify any entrant who has engaged in unlawful or improper conduct.

You agree that if you have a dispute with FCBG or Lonely Planet in relation to this competition or any prize awarded: (1) it will be resolved individually, without resort to any form of class action; (2) any claim will be limited to an action at law for damages and you will not be permitted to obtain attorneys' fees or other legal costs; and (3) you waive all rights to have damages multiplied or otherwise increased and your right to claim indirect, punitive, incidental and consequential damages.

What happens to my entry?

All entries are non-returnable.

You give FCBG and Lonely Planet a worldwide, irrevocable licence to reproduce, publish, adapt, communicate and broadcast all or part of it in any form and media, in relation to the National Non-Fiction November competition. You also consent to us editing, re-using, storing, reproducing and communicating your entry in any medium. We will, to the extent practicable, attribute you as the author.

FCBG and Lonely Planet will only use the personal information contained in your entry to conduct the promotion and award the prize. If you win a prize, FCBG and Lonely Planet may wish to use your name and photograph for future marketing purposes with your express consent.
