INTRODUCTION

Jon has been described as a master of the **absurd** and praised for his use of simple words and pictures to tell some amazing stories. Here the premise of having a rhinoceros for a pet seems somewhat ridiculous – I mean, what could a rhinoceros possibly do?!

The book is likely to start conversations about pets in general and **exotic pets** in particular – a good opportunity to check that your child or children understand the difference between domesticated and exotic pets.

ACTIVITIES

Read: Help your child or children to collect some facts about rhinos from books or online. Where in the world do they come from, how big are they, what do they eat? Are they endangered? The WWF film is a great place to start.

Illustrate or Write: If your child/children could choose any exotic animal as a pet, what would it be? Ask them to draw a picture of their chosen pet and make a list of what they think they would need to look after it. Can they think of any problems or challenges there might be? Or write a Rhino Acrostic Poem.

Make: A rhino mask https://maskspot.com/download/rhino-mask/ Create a diorama showing a rhino (or another chosen animal) in their natural habitat https://www.generationgenius.com/activities/habitats-activity-for-kids/ or the interior of an exotic pets shop.
