INTRODUCTION

Set in both present-day Great Britain and Holland during the Second World War, this is a story about family, resilience, courage, friendship, bullying and ultimately hope. It focuses on the dangerous work of the Dutch resistance, and although it is less harrowing than When the World Was Ours, it doesn't shy away from the realities of war – with incidents of hardship, betrayal and self-sacrifice

When clearing her grandmother's house, Liv discovers a box which contains clues about Bubbe's childhood in **Amsterdam** during the **Nazi Occupation** and her sister Hannie's commitment to leading **Jewish children** to safety. Narrated by Liv, Mila, Hannie and Willem, a boy who befriends Mila, but is suspected of betrayal, although later we discover he is one of the children rescued by Hannie. When introducing the book, read aloud from 'Saturday' on p19 to the end of p23. This section, which is set in the present day, provides an insight into Liv's deteriorating friendship with Karly and her developing relationship with Bubbe, her grandmother.

ACTIVITIES

Read about and research the real-life story of **Anne Frank** who would have been hiding in the Secret Annex around the same time that the fictional sisters Mila and Hannie were living undercover in Amsterdam. See film in Links.

Write or illustrate Suggest your child or children write a letter to the author to tell them how the story made them feel. <u>Or</u> illustrate a favourite character or scene.

Create a comic strip version of one of the key episodes in the book or character profiles for each of the four narrators.
