THE FINAL YEAR

Older Readers Shortlist 2024

INTRODUCTION

This is a moving, emotionally-charged **verse-novel** about 10 -year-old Nate, his **family** and **friends** and his final year at primary school. Much of this will resonate with readers, young and old, but his personal life is complex and challenging. He has a lot to cope with – a young single mother who likes to drink and gamble, two younger brothers who he often has to care for, and his own **anger** to keep at bay. He loses his best friend (though only temporarily), and his little brother is hospitalised with a **life-threatening heart condition**. Fortunately, Mr Joshua, his new form teacher, sees a spark inside Nate that is lit by a **love of reading and writing** and shows him how to use this to process what's going on.

ACTIVITIES

Read Give your child or children the opportunity to browse and dip into a wide range of poetry collections and anthologies. Encourage them to pick out some favourite poems to read aloud and share. **Write or illustrate** a personal response to *The Final Year* (which could be submitted for the Portfolios) <u>or pick</u> one of the activities suggested in the resource pack (in the Links).

Create a Poet-Tree display. This could be used to display different forms of poems, poems by a selection of poets, thematic, seasonal or favourite poems. <u>Or create</u> a personal anthology, to illustrate & add to over time.
